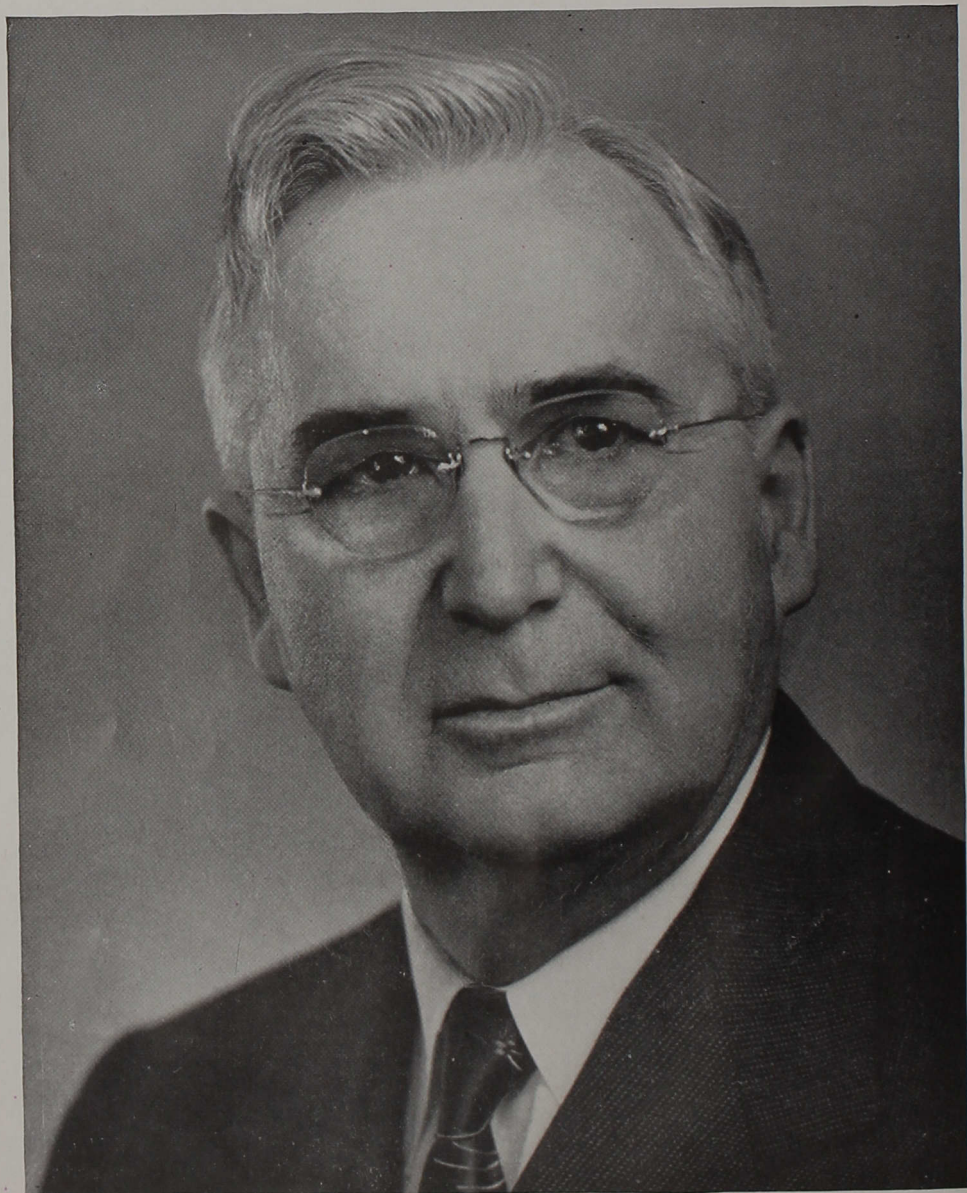

He was a Crusader, leading the infant college through the hard days of childhood diseases and adolescent awkwardness, when folk found it easy to say, "It will never survive!" When the church people saw that the youthful president believed in the college and gave himself to it, not for the selfish reason of making an organization go, but for the sake of the church and for what the Christian College could contribute in the way of leadership, they crusaded with him.

He saw to it that the college maintained high Christian and moral standards as well as intellectual standards. These standards bore fruit in his own family and in the college family, because he believed sincerely in the principles for which he stood and fought fearlessly. As one former student said, "I went into his office rebellious and came out convinced that I had much to give to life."

For years he prayed, worked, and pleaded for the payment of debt and the raising of endowment, never fully realizing his dream, but seeing the institution grow and the people's faith in it grow. When the General Conference of the church made possible the recent Victory Campaign, President Good, at great cost to himself, lead the way. For at least two years he spent his Sundays presenting the needs of the Church in pulpits and in homes, soliciting funds from early Monday until late Thursday, then driving to the college to attempt the handling of college problems until Saturday noon. If he rested it was on his drive on Saturday afternoon to his next appointment for Sunday. Many people said that his solicitations were not mere askings for money, but were heart to heart talks outlining a vision of the privilege of giving, not only to the college, but to the whole church program.

This year when the debt was paid the Alumni honored him with a banquet and presented him with a watch and chain as a visible token of their great esteem for him.

After thirty-five years of service to the college he was voted retirement, but continued to crusade by raising funds for our sister college at York, Nebraska, and died while serving as legislative counsel of the United Dry Forces of Indiana.

He still crusades with the Heavenly Father in the broad horizons of eternity. He has joined that great cloud of witnesses who hover near to cheer us on to greater endeavor with Christ.

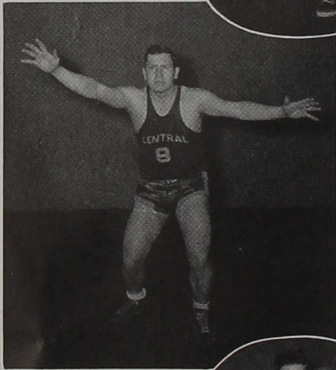
Indiana Central Greyhounds

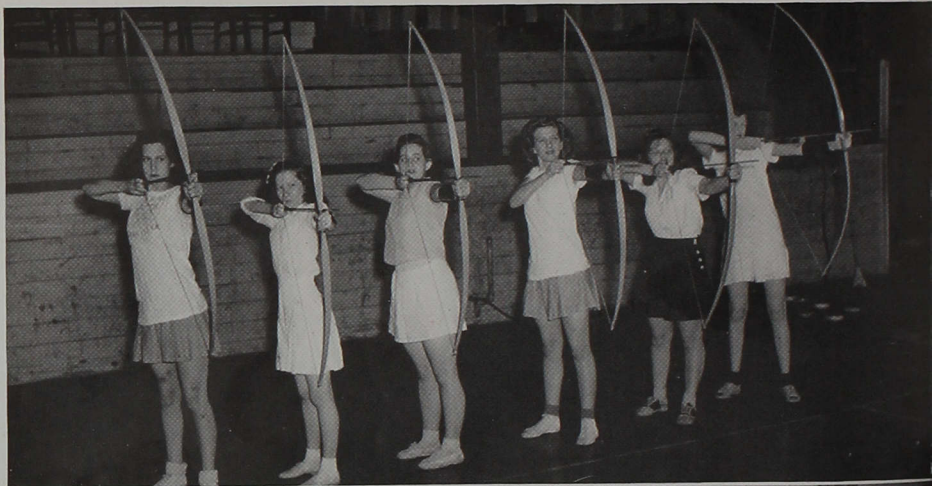

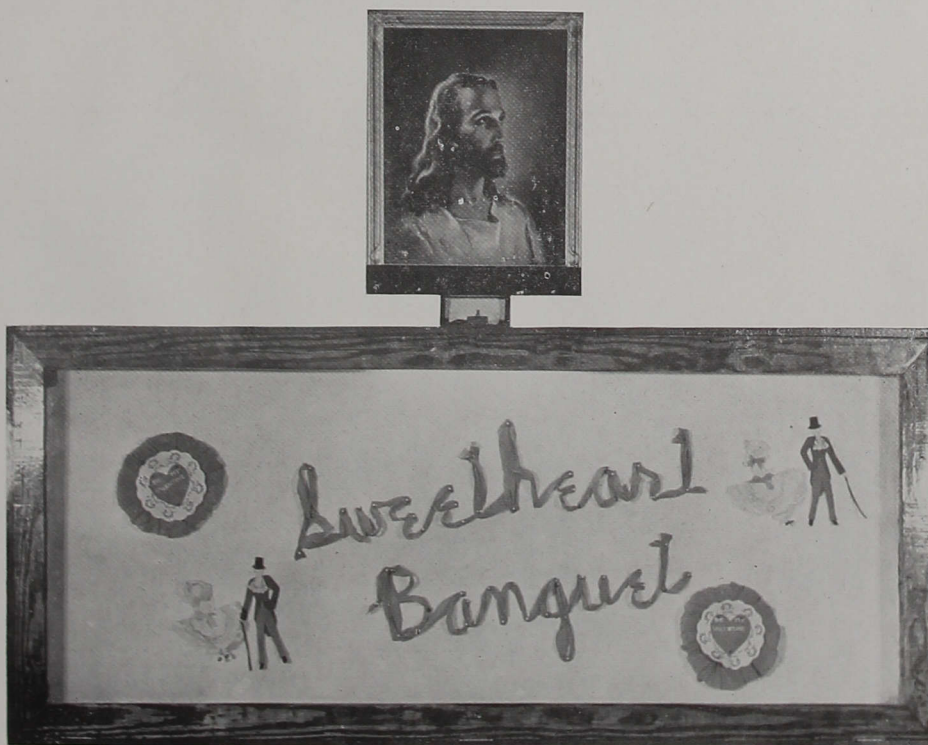
