



Indiana Central Is Both An Old


Indiana Central College, incorporated on October 7, 1902, began its academic work in September, 1905, and received recognition as a standard college by the State Board of Education in 1921. On a campus of fifty-nine acres, the administration building, pictured above, the four dormitories, gymnasium, observatory, president's residence, and the married students' residences are located.

Students from seven foreign countries and sixteen states are counting this college as their second home.




The Student Council represents all students and all interest groups on the campus. It acts as a channel through which student requests and suggestions may be made to the faculty and administration.







Greyhounds Out Pass And

Injuries hampered the start of the season for the Greyhounds as there were six of the starting eleven who did not see any action the first four games.

Central fell before Alma, Findlay, Hanover, and Beloit, then caught fire and won over Manchester.

A bad break in the Anderson game proved fatal, then the Greyhounds came back to finish the season with three straight wins--Taylor, Franklin, and Earlham.

Central scored 172 points to the opponents 184, gained 701 yards on pass-

ing to the opponents 602 yards, and gained 1849 yards rushing to the opponents 1669 yards.

Maciejewski completed 21 of 24 extra points on kicking, and all 21 of these were consecutive.

Fallowfield and Barton were the only Greyhounds elected to the all-conference team. Hunt was leading ground gainer with 624 yards and Fallowfield followed with 455. Buntin and Fallowfield tied for top honors in the scoring column as they each made five touchdowns.




NETMEN DEMONSTRATE






Coach Nicoson's team turned in an impressive record with the close of the baseball season. Winning 12 and dropping only four games gave the Greyhounds first place in the conference


