

Be yourself. Especially do not feign affection. Neither be cynical about love; for in the face of all aridity and disenchantment, it is as perennial as the grass . . .




ABOVE Steve Harding seems almost as excited as Marie Carlson when she is announced as homecoming queen.
















ALUMNI RESPOND TO TELETHON

Although the Telethon was primarily to raise money for the college, many students enjoyed just talking to graduates of Central.

















FESTIVAL THEME IS UP UP AND AWAY























TRACK TEAM FINISHES THIRD IN INDIANA COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

The track squad of Jerry England improved steadily during the season and culminated with a third place finish in the Indiana Collegiate Conference. Conference champs a year ago, England's team was predominately underclassmen in 1974 and, with added experience, should return as a conference title contender next year. Top performer for the Greyhound tracksters this season was 6-5, 260 pound Jerry Allgood, who set new Central standards in the shot put and in the discus. Allgood qualified for the national meet at Eastern Illinois University as did Rick Stover, who set a school record in the steeplechase with a time of 9:24.8. The 440 relay record of 43.1 was set this year by Dick Nalley, Mark Fisher, Gary Hall, and Jeff Davis, each of whom will return next year. Jerry Allgood received the Highest Point Award for the 'Hounds. Mark Fisher also tied the school record of 56.2 in the Intermediate Hurdles.





Brooks was selected by his teammates as the 1974 Most Valuable Player and also won the John Yeftich Memorial Award for hitting proficiency.




I.C.C. GOLF


