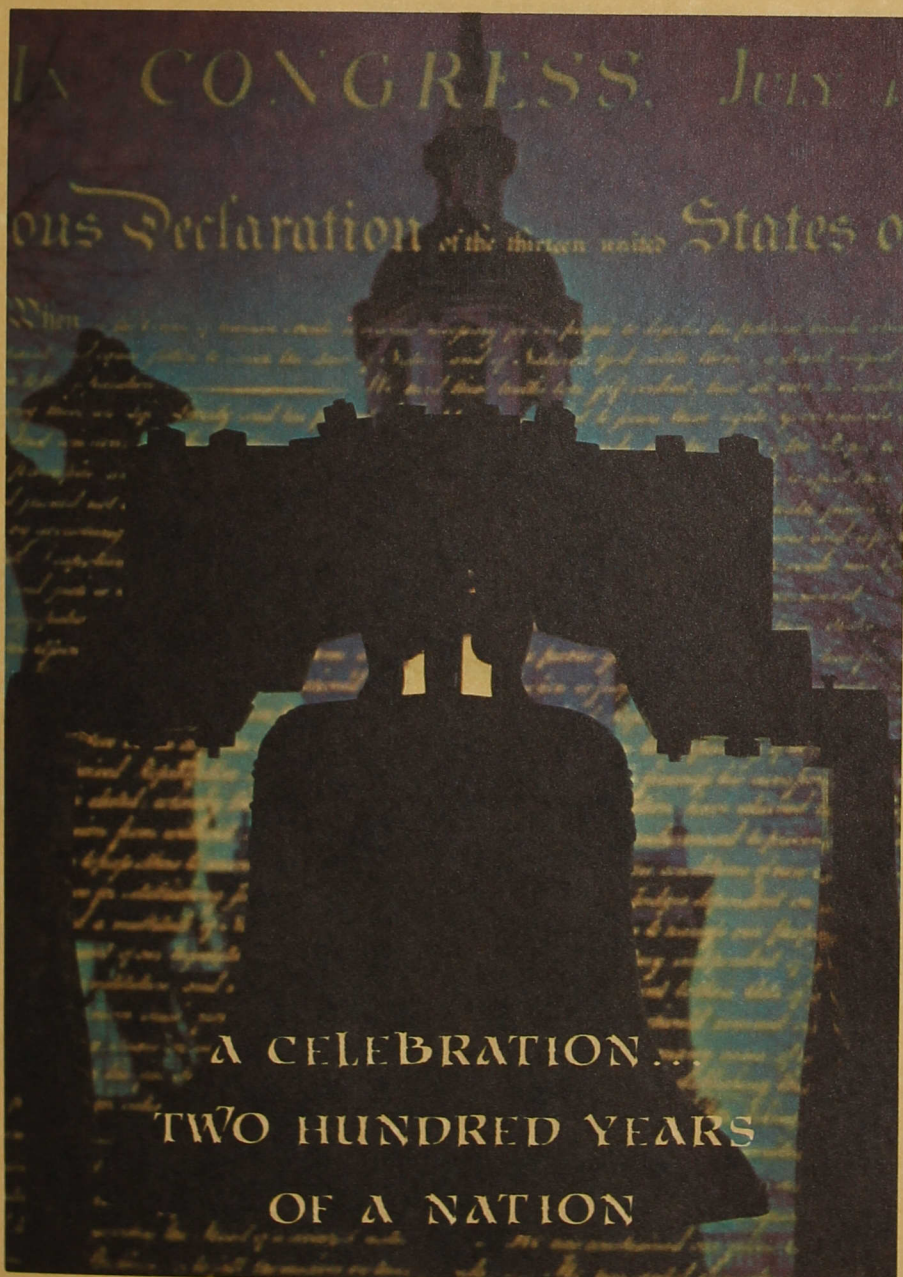

DARE TO BE DIFFERENT







IN CONGRESS, July 4,  
1776  
The Continental Congress  
declared the thirteen united States of  
America.  
When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bonds which connect them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.  
We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.  
That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, that whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.  
Prudence, in such a case, dictates that慎重 should be paid to the Rights of the Colonies, and that a peaceable separation should be attempted.  
But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object, evinces a design to reduce them to absolute Tyranny, it is their duty, when a prudent consideration of the consequences shall render it impracticable to secure them by other means, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.  
Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies, such has been their gradual increase of population, and the spread of the most extensive and valuable Agriculture, Commerce and Fishery, that they have now reached a state, in which a majority of the Colonies are united by a common Interest, and a common Sense of their Rights, to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with Great Britain, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them.  
We therefore the Representatives of the thirteen united States of America, in General Congress assembled, do hereby declare, that these United Colonies are, and have a right to be free States, free and independent States, absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connections between them and Great Britain are, and ought to be, totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, enter into Commercials, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do.

The break from England was not to come easily, as this fledgling was viewed as a serious threat to the tentacles of the vast and far-flung British Empire.





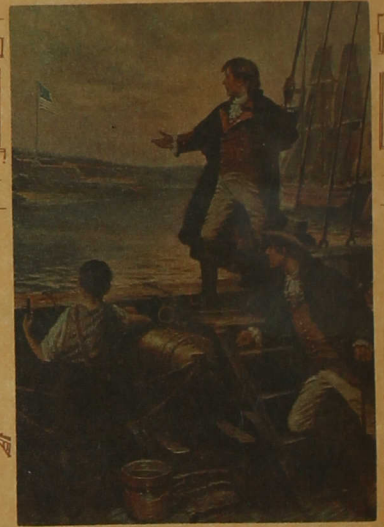




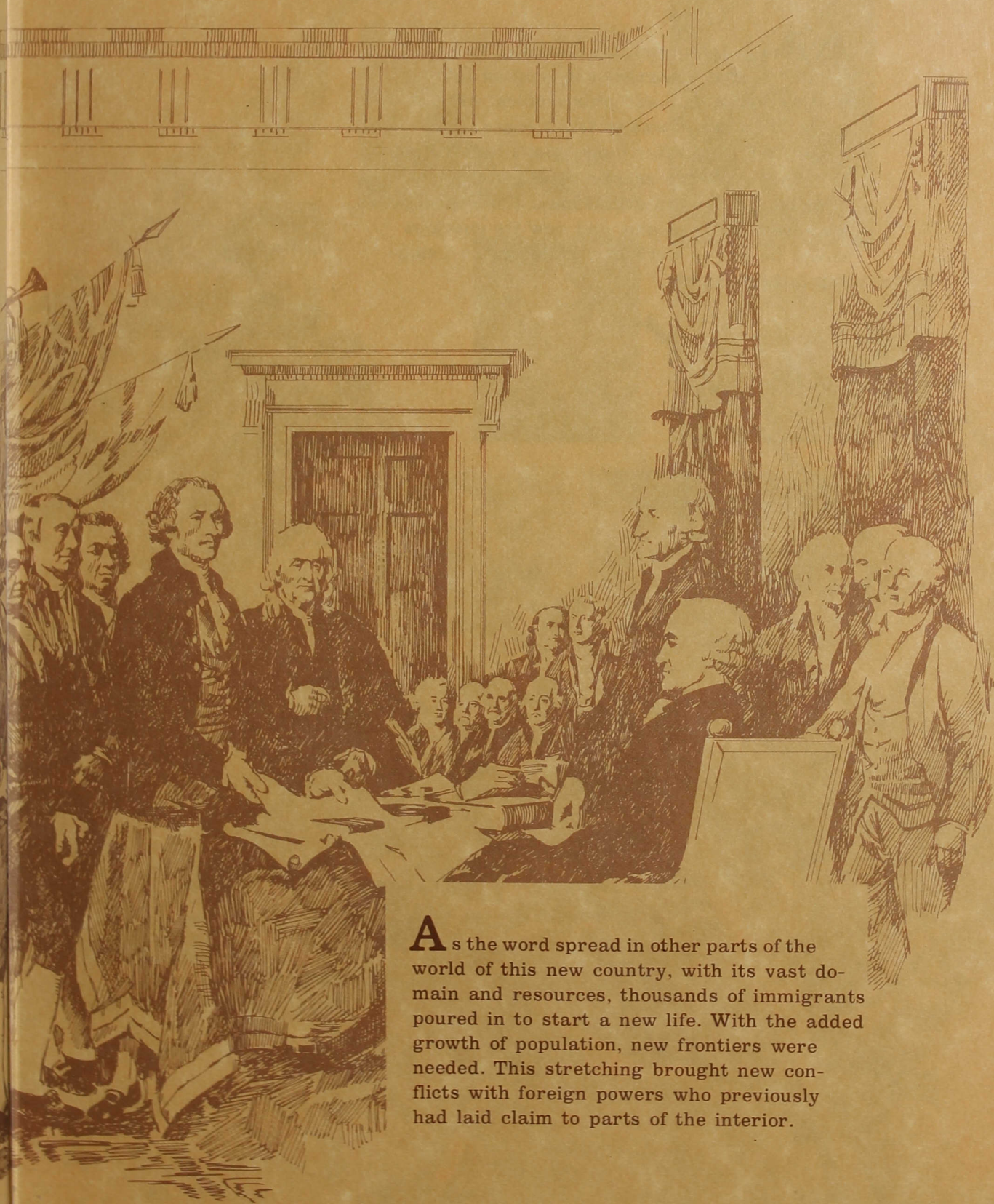


**P**atriots rose from every corner of the struggling country. Help came from other European countries to add to the flame of breaking the grip of England. As the smoke began to clear, ideas on organizing this diversity of colonies into a coalition of united states began to take shape. The form of a Constitution and Bill of Rights was molded by statesmen who previously were nonexistent.





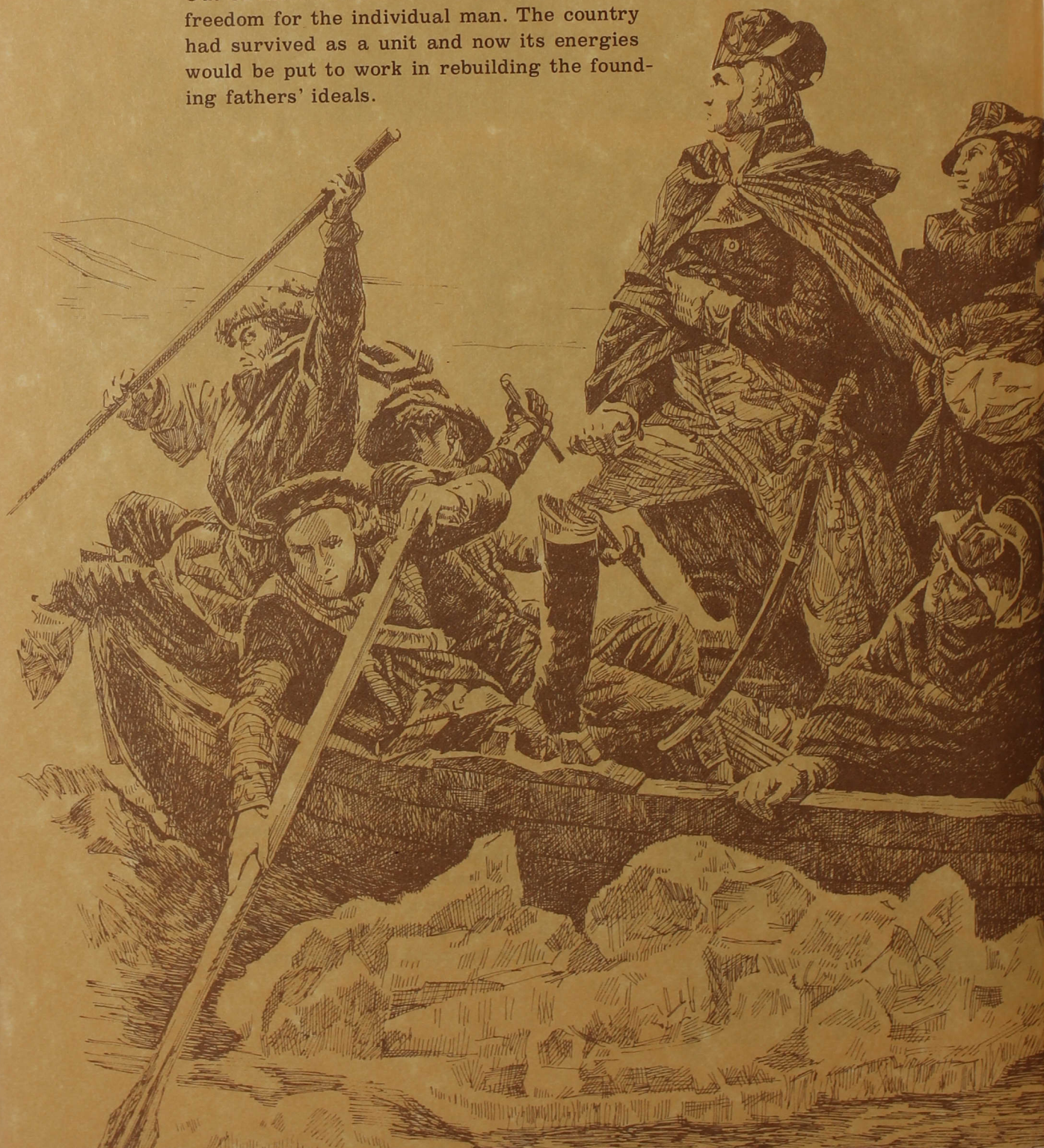




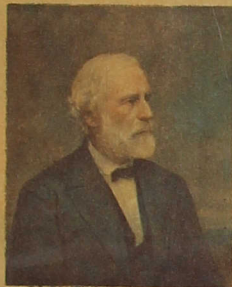
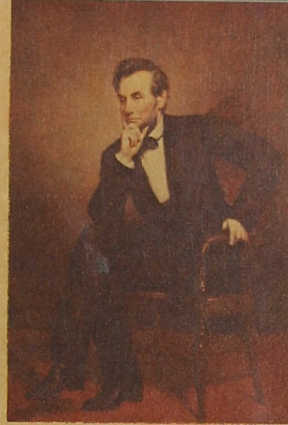
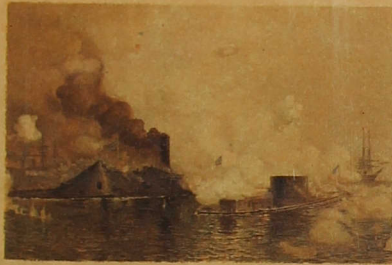
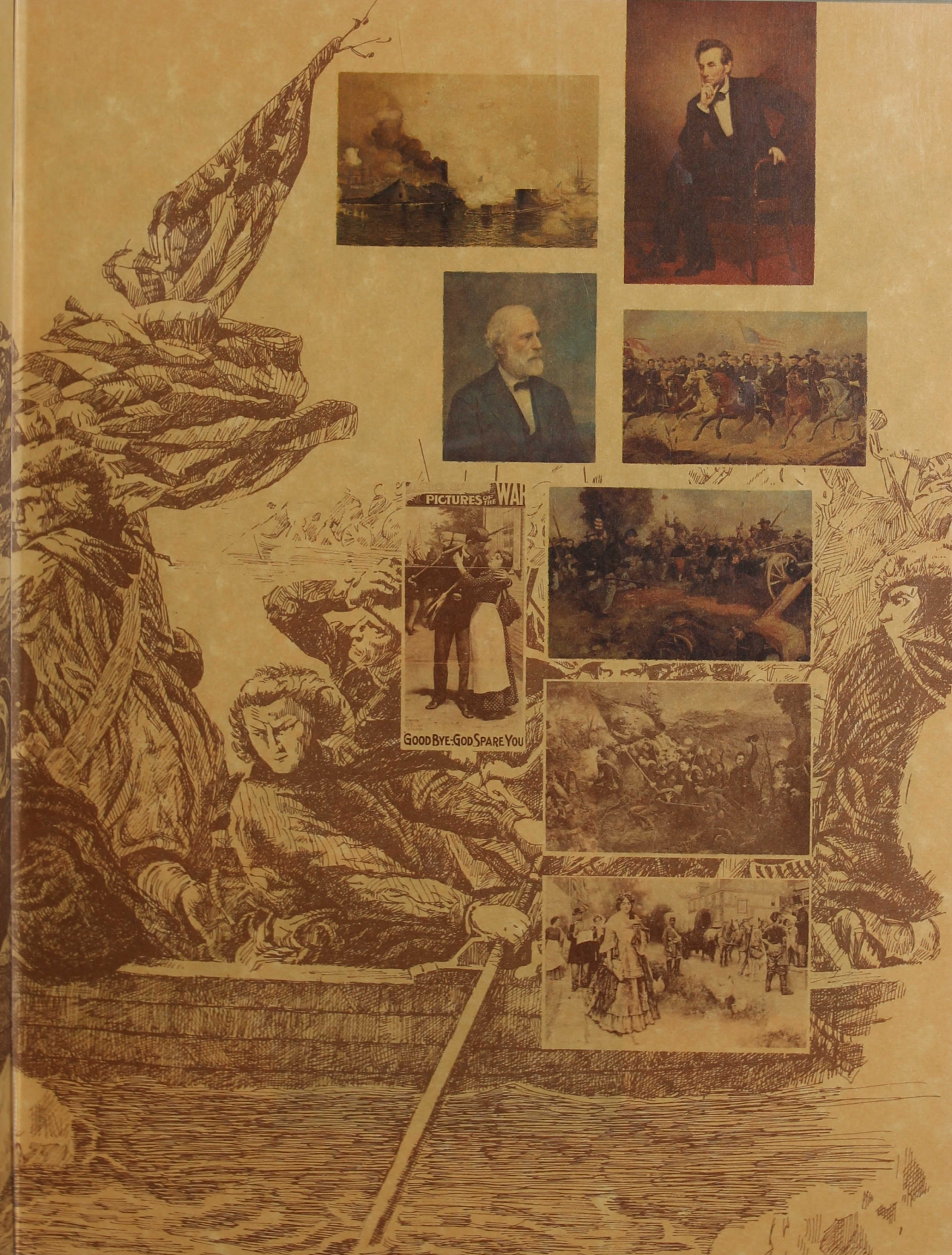

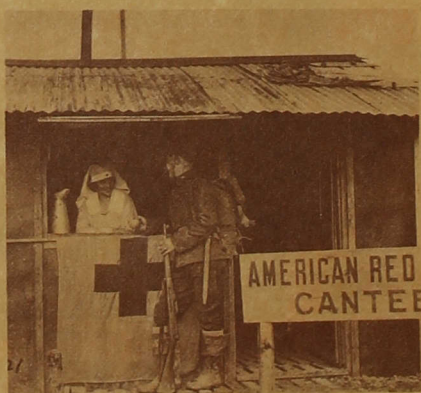
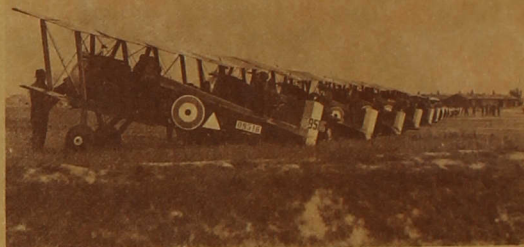






**T**he need for new frontiers continued as movement spread West. A rapid explosion of technological advances pointed the country into the fore as an industrialized nation.



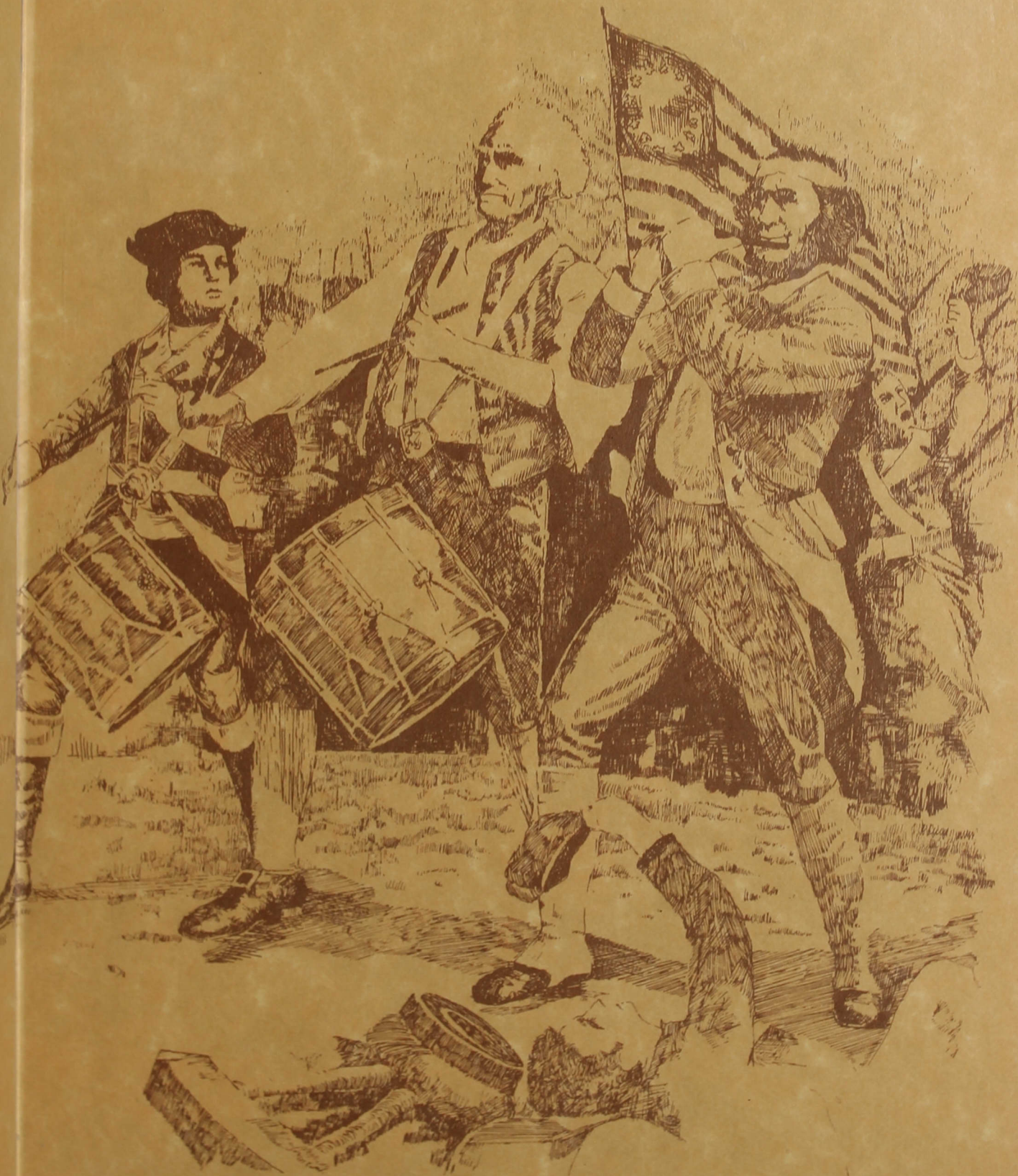

New leaders were sought to pull the Country out of its fall, while on the horizon new storm clouds were building across the oceans.



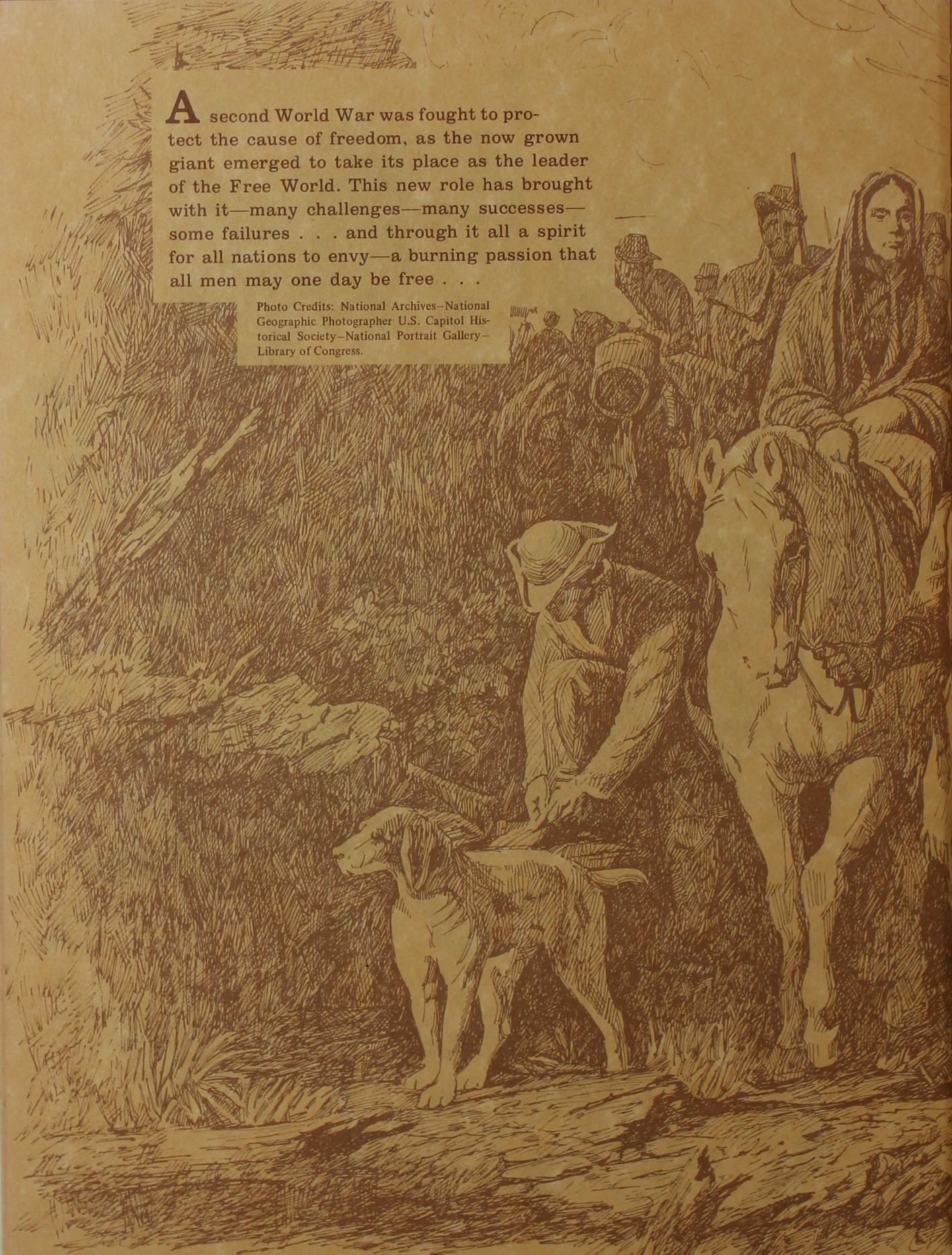




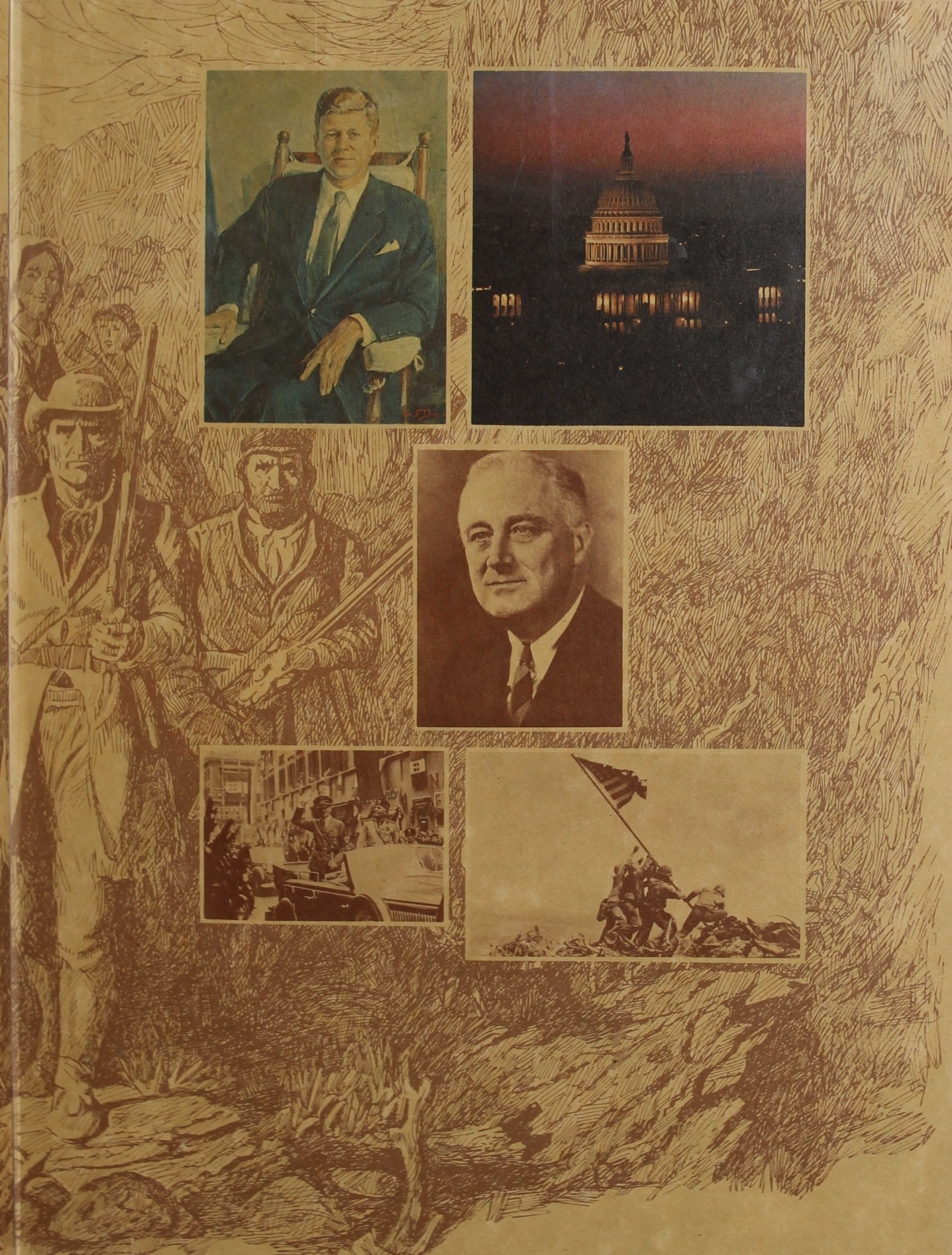
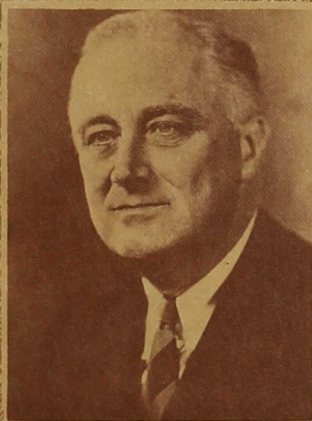

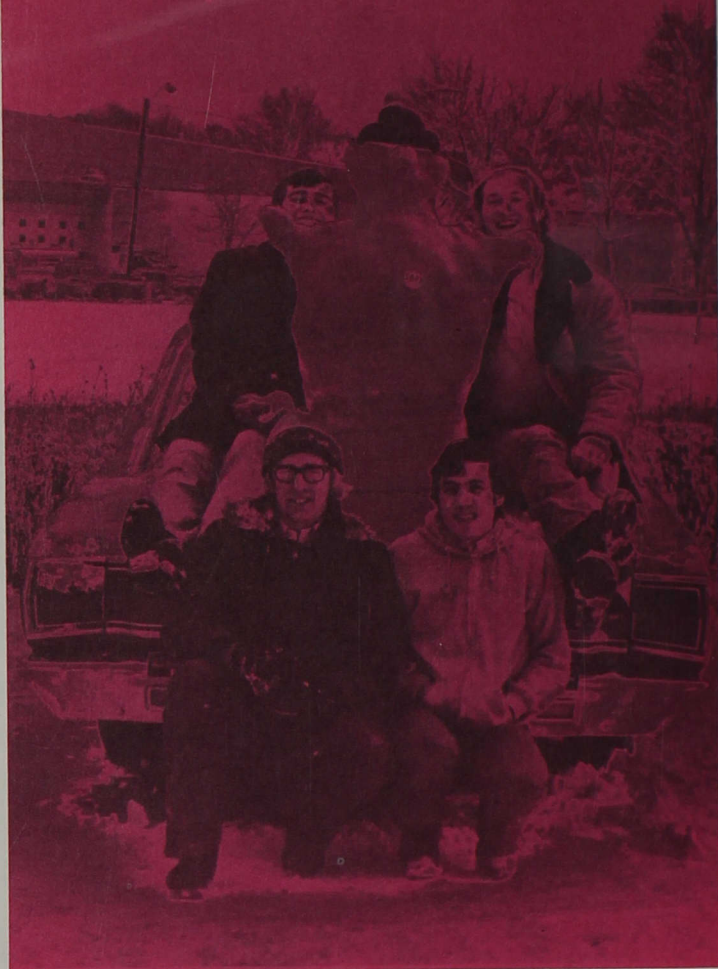
# THE DIFFERENCE

But we didn't have a bad rebirth year, at that.



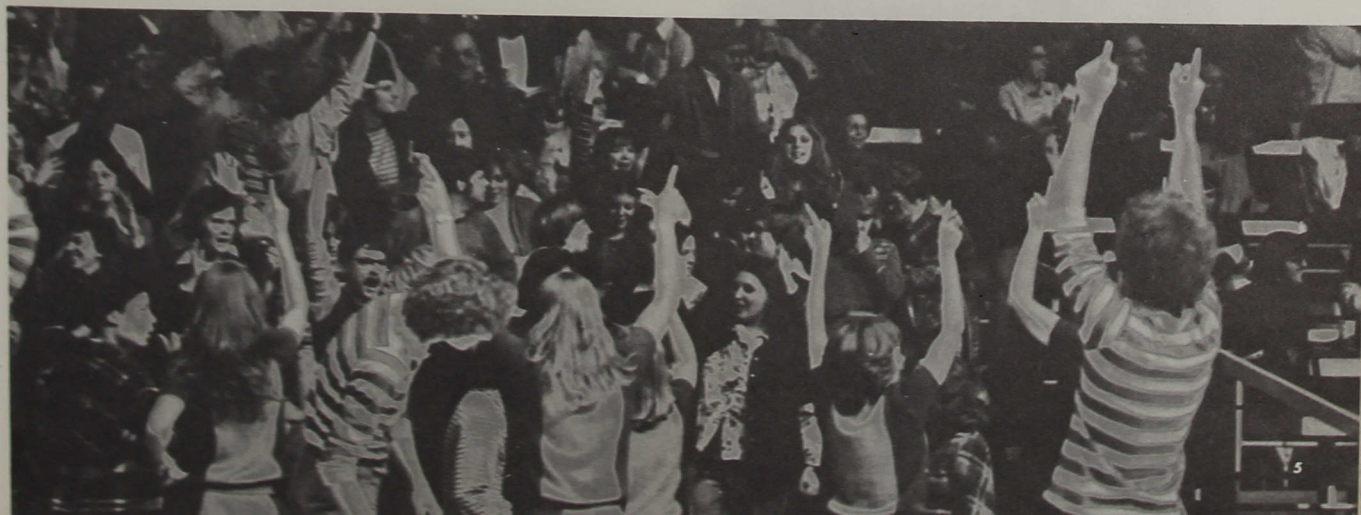

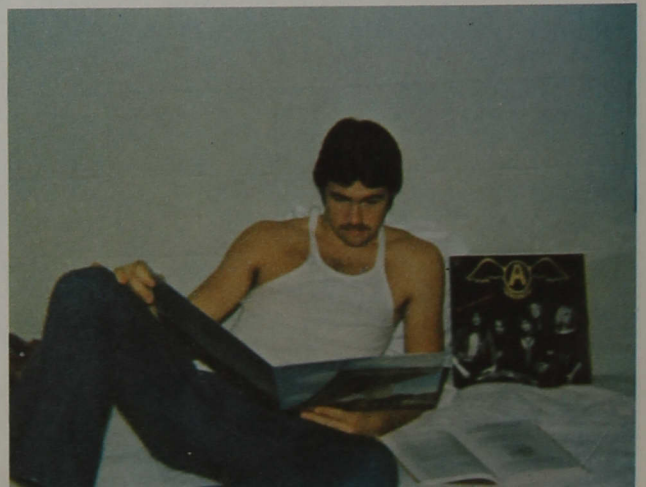
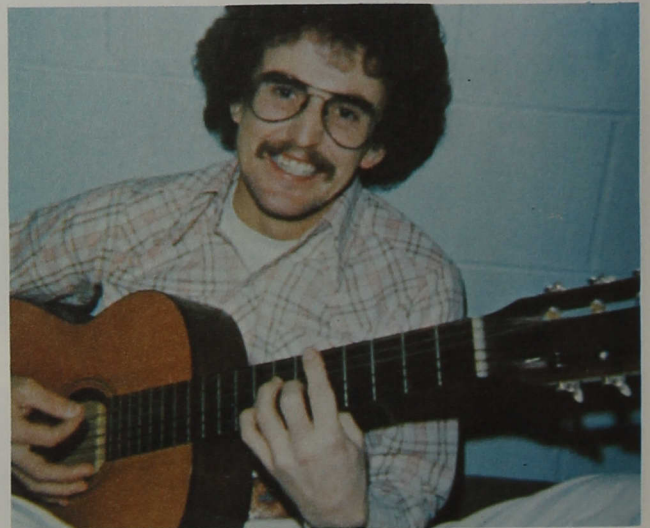
What do students do as individuals or as a group? All sorts of interaction (most of it comic) pops up in the dorms and classrooms, with an appropriate time for study or personal relaxation.

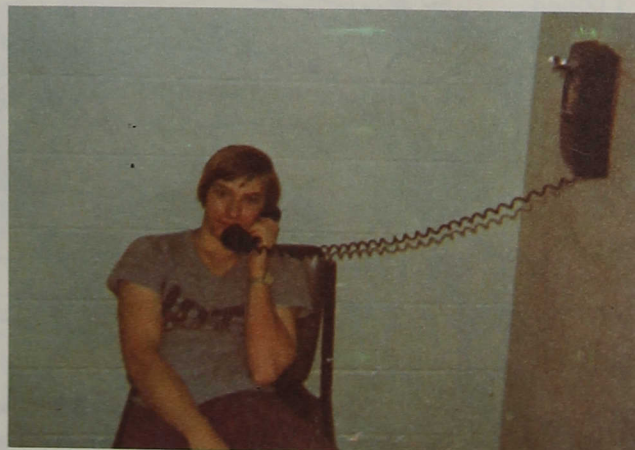

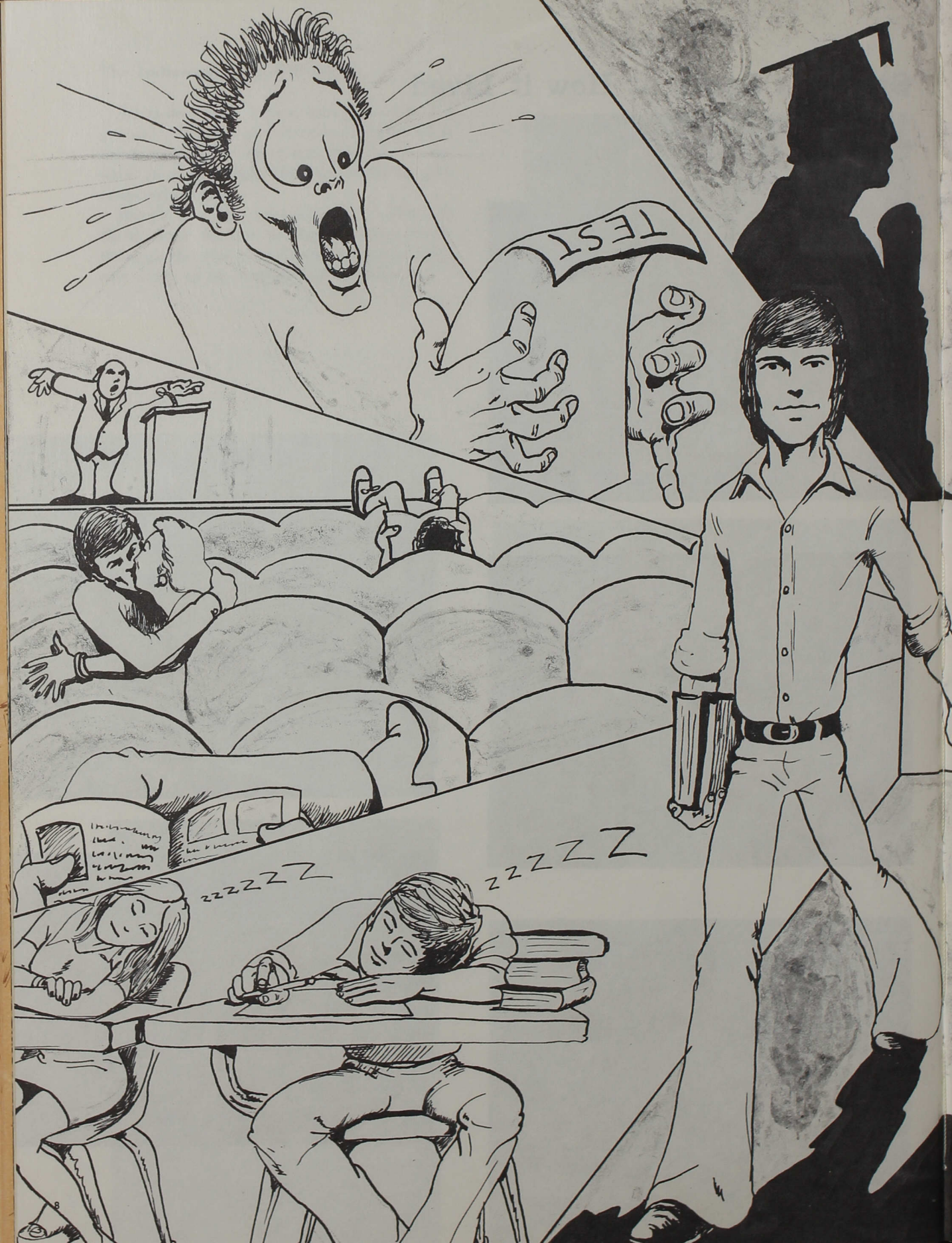




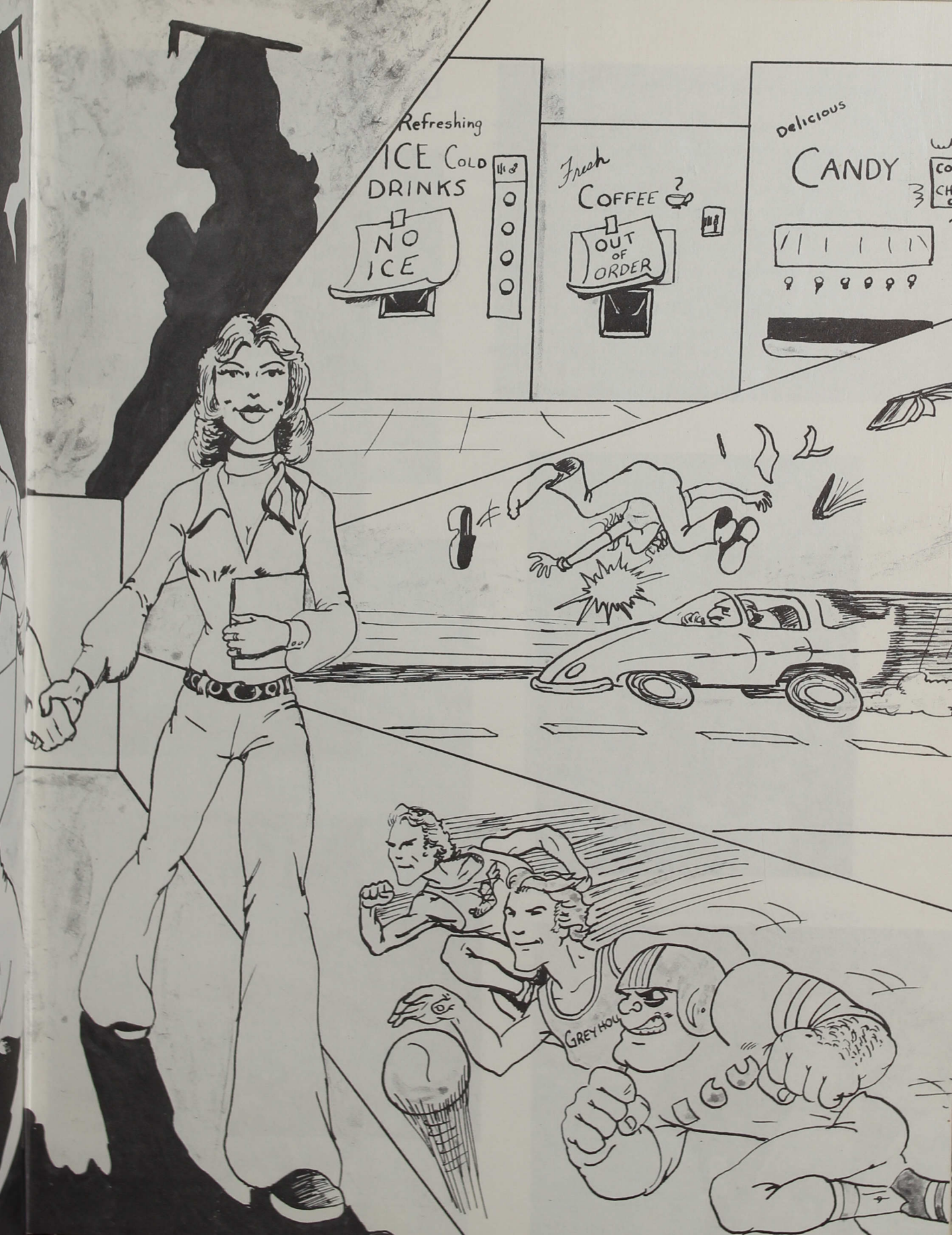

The American difference: now it is our turn to understand it and build with it.



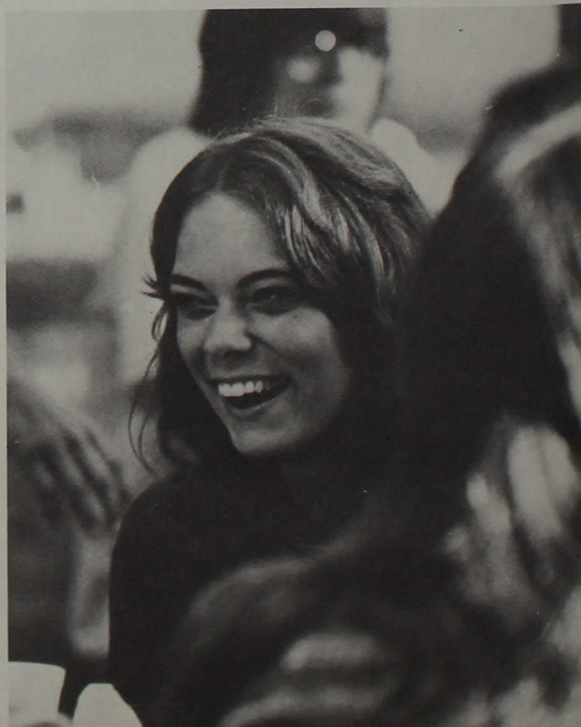
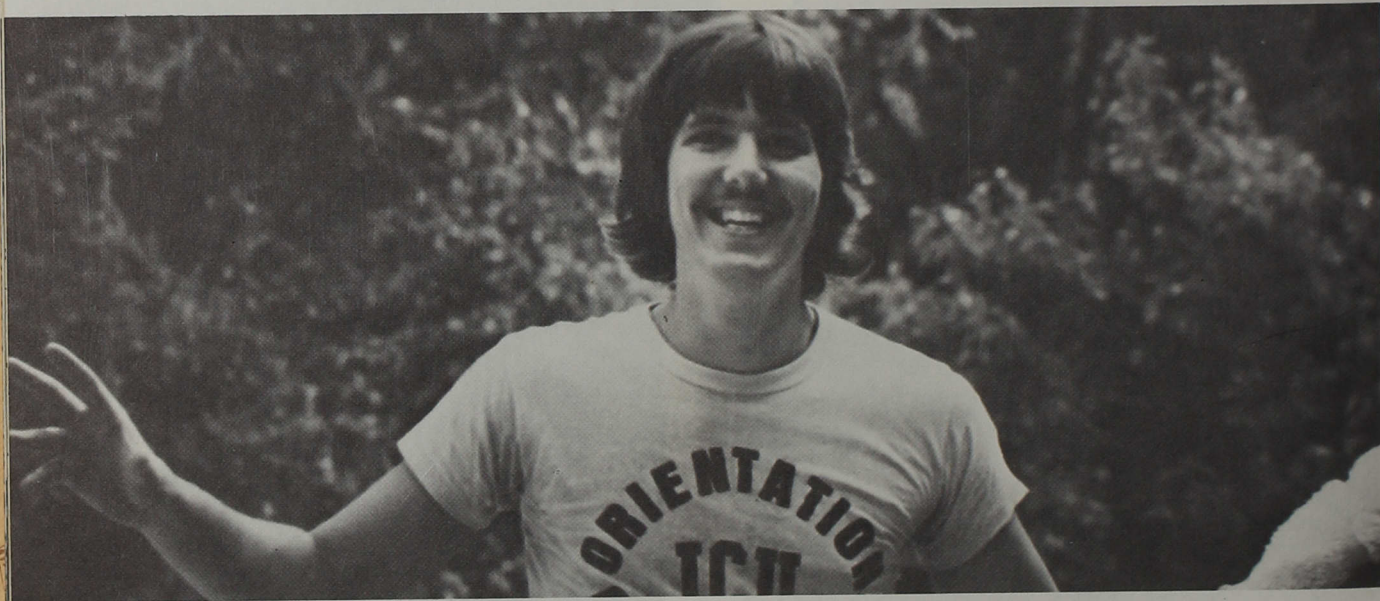

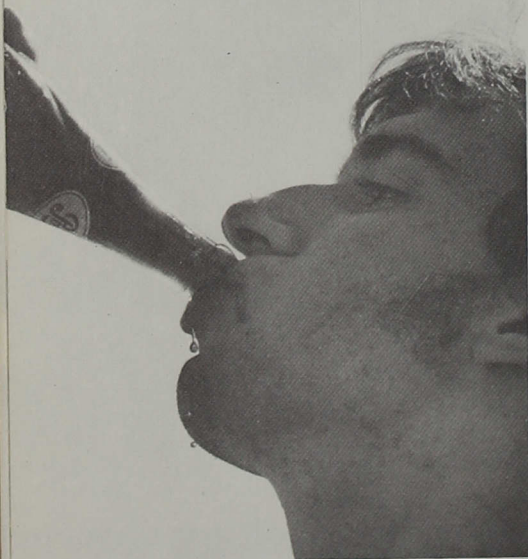


October 4 was a day-and-a-half. The Cross-Country crew fell to the Alumni, but the Super-Stars stunt competition made everybody happy.

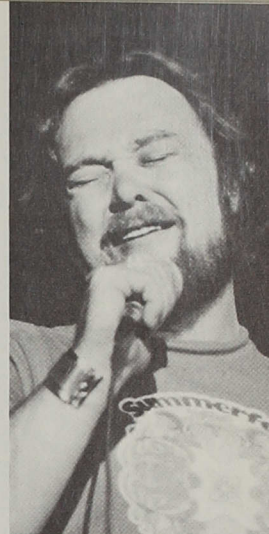
The Sophs took the overall title after all the field goals, blind football passes, water balloon relays, frisbee throwing, and multi-stunt relays were done.

Blood, Sweat, and Tears had returned the previous night — and how!

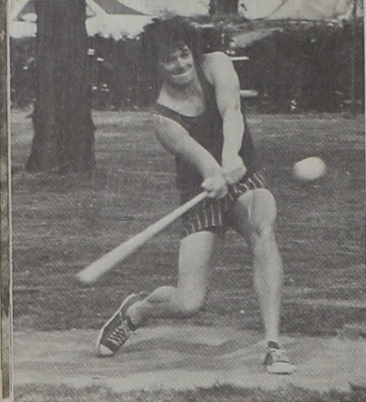

Again, I want to apologize to all of the students who were offended or embarrassed.

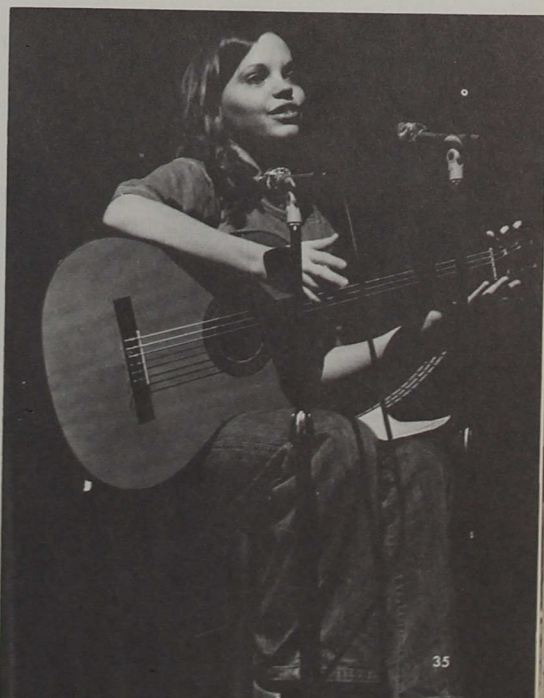

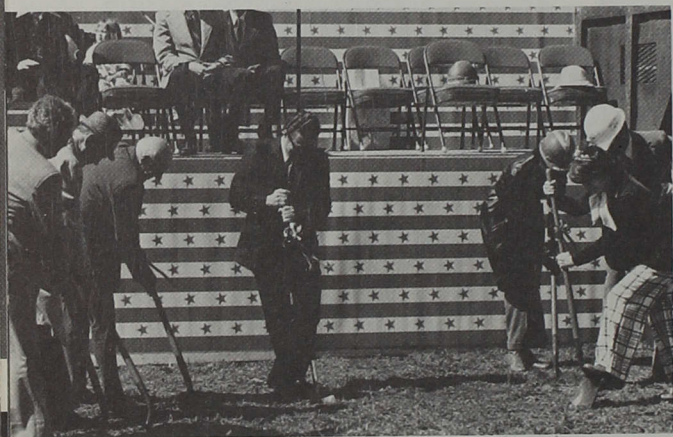




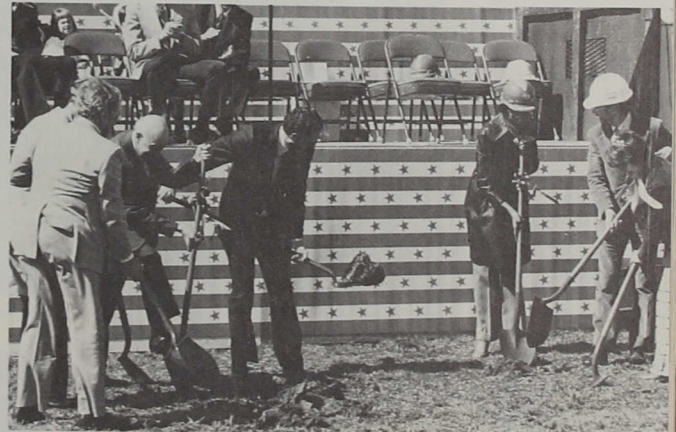
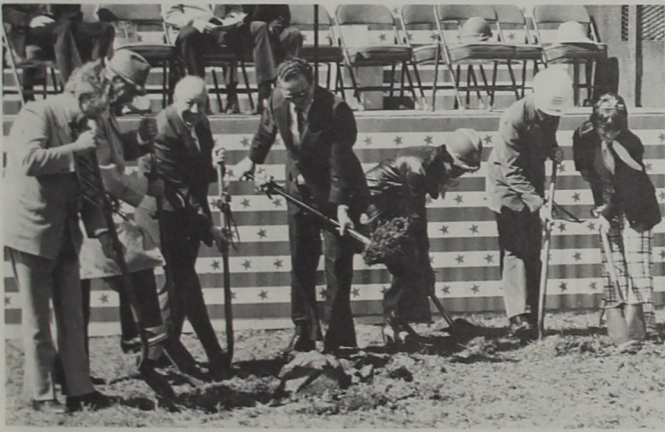
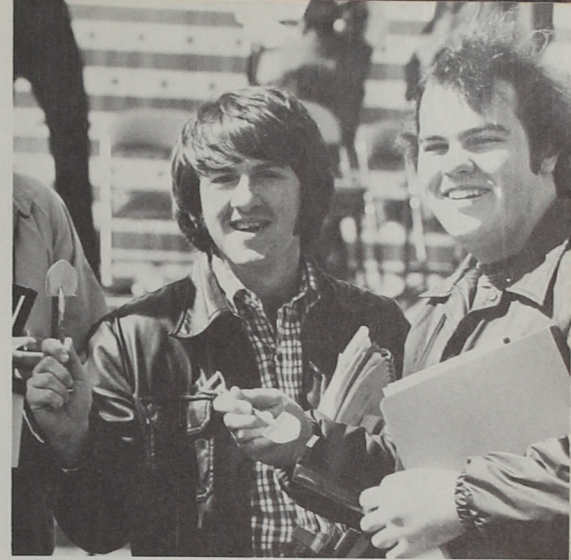
## Groundbreaking: Toward the Future

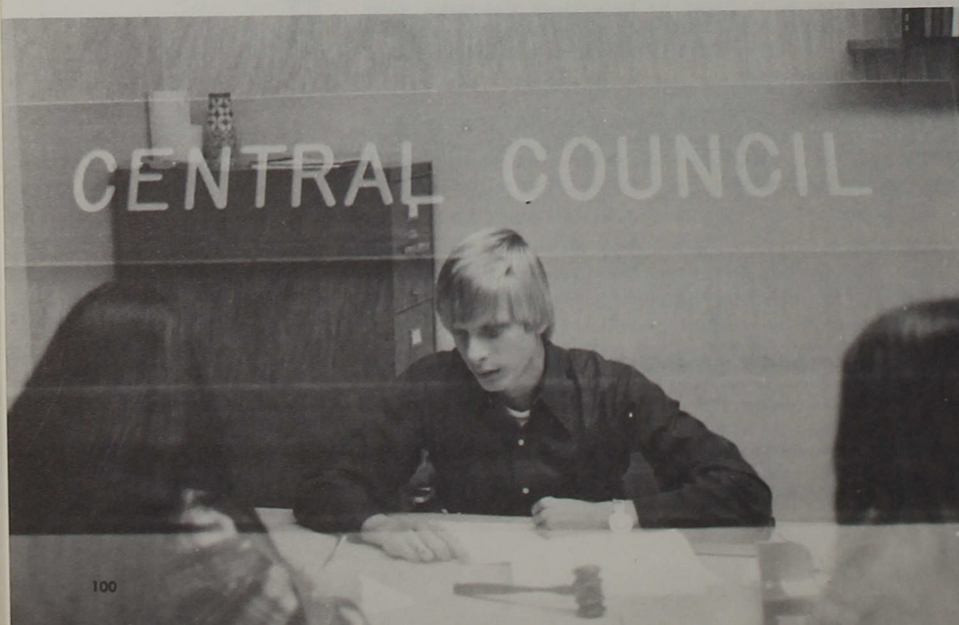
## ORGANIZATIONS

In the past, they were THE focal point of extracurricular life here.

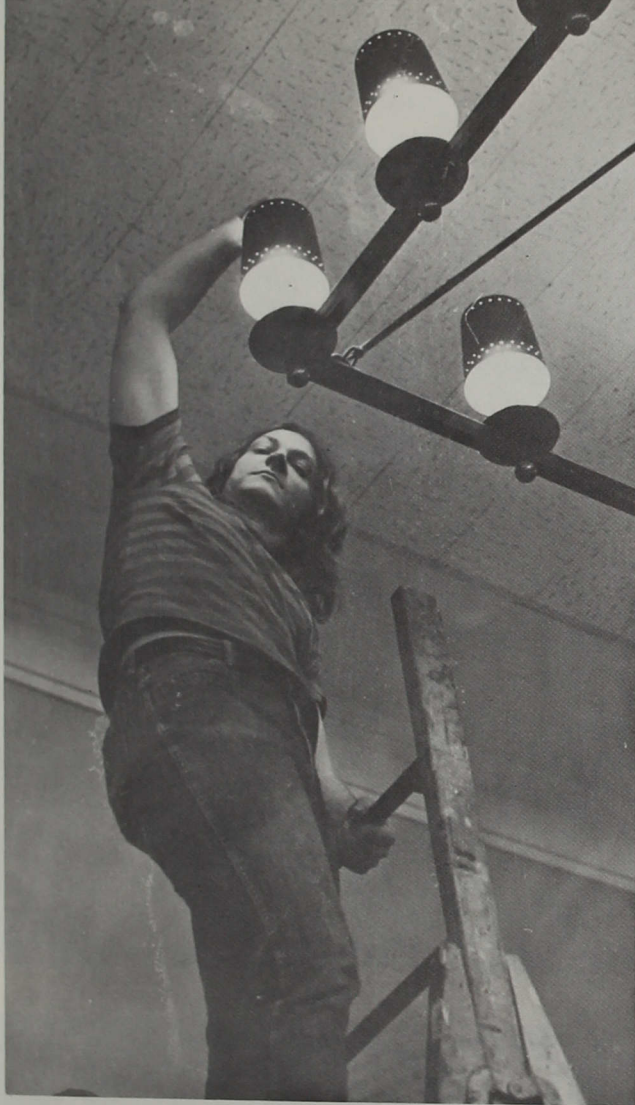

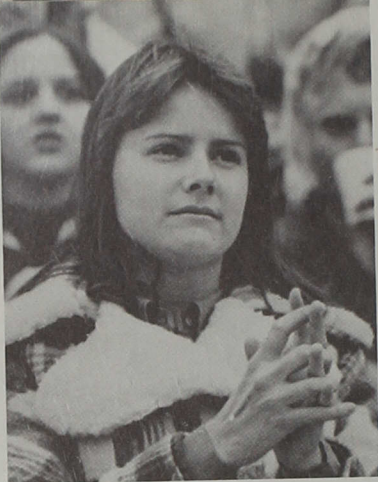

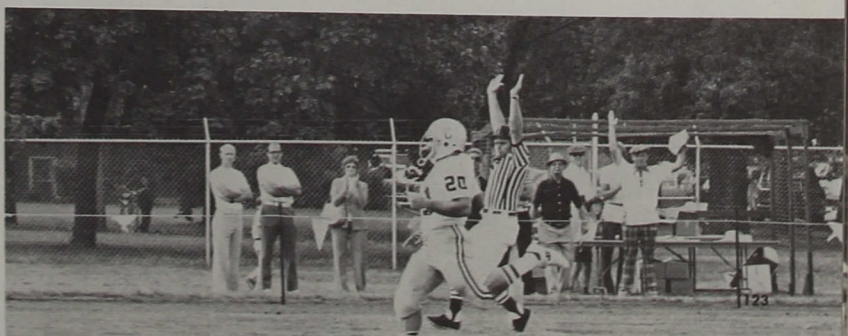
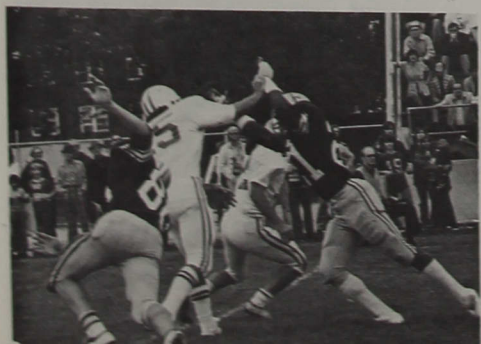

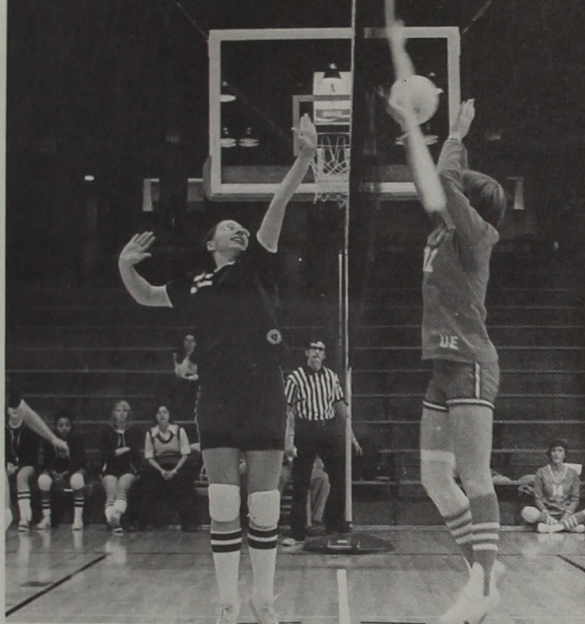

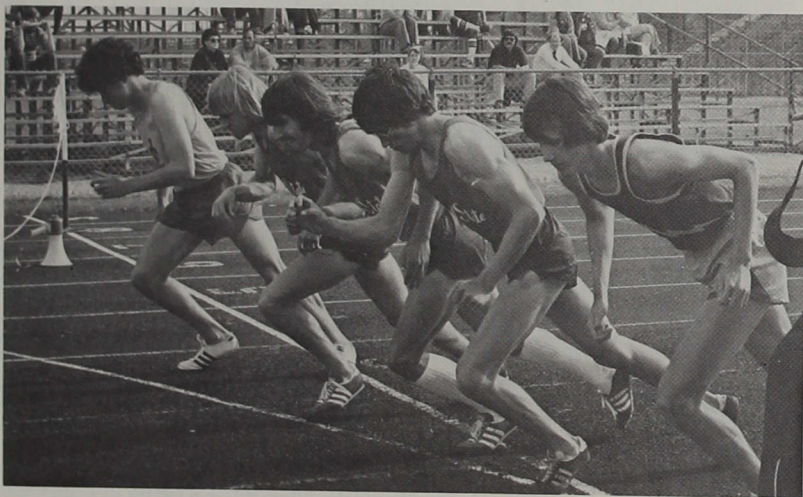

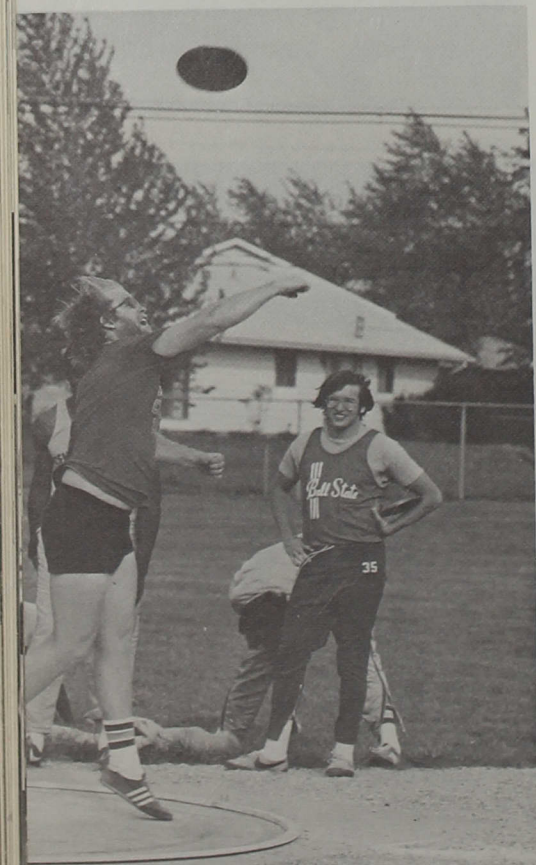

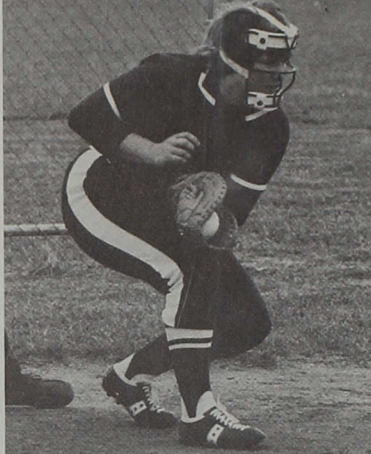

# SPECIFICATIONS

The 1976 edition of the Oracle, the yearbook of Indiana Central University, was designed by the staff on campus at ICU between December 3, 1975, and June 21, 1976. It was processed and printed at the Inter-Collegiate Press, located at 6015 Travis Lane, Shawnee Mission, Kansas 66012.

The cover is the Special Bicentennial Embossed design prepared by the company, padded, with heavy board, in Duotone material. The cover type style is Stonehenge, silk-screened onto the cover in gold color.

The liners and the 160 school-prepared pages are white vellum paper stock, 100% recycled. The book is signature-bound. The headline type style is Clarendon Medium, and the copy type style is Bodoni.

The general layout design is the Mondrian style, named after the painting style of the Dutch artist Piet Mondrian. Its main characteristic is the absence of a regular outside white margin, which is covered by pictures extending to the outer page edge.

The 16-page Bicentennial Signature was prepared by the company as a unique tribute to America's 200 years of freedom. The Oracle '76 shares the use of this signature with many other yearbooks across the country also manufactured by the Inter-Collegiate Press.
