

Several members of the faculty and staff joined many students in the run. The ideal weather, the fun and jovial mood of the contestants made the day one of the most memorable of the year.


ICU alum, Gary Romesser won the event in an outstanding time of 32:37. Gary currently holds ICU records in the mile, 2 mile and 3 mile events.








Homecoming Brings Brown County Day, Queen Coronation



TEAM, INDIVIDUAL RECORDS FALL

Wade, Williams, "Wish" First Teamers; 11 Earn HCC Honors





The 1980 edition of Greyhound football was another winner for Coach Bill Bless and crew. The Hounds had a record of 5-4-2, while placing fourth in the Heartland collegiate conference behind Franklin (5-2), Ashland (5-2), and St. Joseph's (4-3). The Hounds were 3-3-1 in league play. Coach Bless' men were in contention for the conference crown until the loss at Butler in the tenth game of the season.

Fourteen Greyhounds were named to the All-HCC team in 1980. From the offense, sophomore fullback Mike Wishnevski and sophomore tackle Wade Hall were awarded first team honors. senior guard Jeff Bates, sophomore center Jim Landwerlen, and junior tight end Bob Brewer were named to the second team offense. Receiving Honorable Mention were junior Bob bohannon, a flanker, and freshman halfback Greg Scarpone.

Defensively, junior end Scott Williams, who played in just seven games before injuring his knee, was named to the first team. Three Hounds were selected to the second team defense. they were senior middle guard Dennis Young, sophomore linebacker Pat Parks, and sophomore linebacker Tim Motsinger.

Junior tackle Lee Hickam, scott Armstrong, a junior defensive back, and senior defensive back Mike campbell each received Honorable Mention from the conference.

The 1980 Co-Captains were Bates and Young. Wishnevski, who set a school record for yards rushing in a season (1,106), was named the Most Valuable Offensive Player of 1980. Hickam was honored as the Most Valuable Defensive Player of the past season. Bates and Brewer were picked the Most Valuable Linemen, and Campbell was voted the Most Valuable Defensive Back. Senior Boyd Davis was given the Kelso-Reid Award for mental attitude.

Many team and individual records were either set or equalled during the 1980 grid campaign. They include Wishnevski's 1,106 yards rushing, Williams' six sacks at Evansville, Anthony Pernell's 93 kickoff return at the University of Wisconsin at Platteville. Also accomplished in 1980 were the fewest yards rushing allowed in a game (-62 vs. Evansville), the most quarterback sacks in a game (13 vs. Evansville), and the most interceptions in a game (6 vs. Franklin).







LADY SPIKERS FIFTH IN STATE



Ladies Finish 20-15

Early in their season, Coach Sue Willey and her Lady Greyhound Volleyball team set two goals. They were striving to have a winning season and to finish well in the State Tournament. The fact that the team was returning only five letter winners did not stop these ladies from accomplishing both of their goals. They finished their season with a record of 20 wins against just 15 losses. The Hounds also ended the year as the fifth best team in the State Tournament. Fifth place is the best finish ever by a Greyhound Volleyball team.

The team was led this year by Captain and Most Valuable Player Trina Bluhm, a junior. The Kelso-Reid Mental Attitude Award was given to senior Deb Sweet. Sophomore Tandace Joseph was selected to the All-Tourney team at the Division II State Tournament. Joseph and freshman Kristie Swing were given All-Tournament honors at the Earlham Invitational Tournament.

With all the experience gained this season, and with the return of many standouts, 1981's squad looks to contend again for the Division II State crown. For the season, the Hounds outscored their opponents 997-895 and won a total of 46 games and lost just 35 single games.







Harriers race to HCC, GLVC Honors

Coach Gerry England's Cross Country squad fell just a little bit off the pace they set a year ago. The 1980 club repeated as second place finishers in the Heartland Conference, but slipped from second to third in the Great Lakes Conference. The Harriers also finished seventh in the Big State/Little State.

In the HCC meet, the team showed balance as Dean Rich was fourth, Doug Esopenko seventh, Marc Adams tenth, Doug Zehr thirteenth, and Bob Albright sixteenth. In the GLVC race, balance was again the order of the day as Esopenko finished sixteenth, Rich nineteenth, Zehr twentieth, Adams twenty-second, Albright twenty-third, Rex Collins twenty-fifth, and Phil Martin was twenty-ninth.

At the Big State/Little State meet the Greyhounds were paced by Esopenko in twentieth place. Rich was close behind in twenty-second place. Adams and Zehr finished in forty-third and forty-sixth place respectively.

Esopenko, a sophomore, was voted the Most Valuable Runner for 1980, while Adams, a senior was given the Kelso-Reid Mental Attitude Award. Adams was also the Captain of the team this year.

Ginger Dobler was named the Most Improved for 1980.



New Era Begins At ICU; Hounds Surprise Some


A new era in Indiana Central basketball history began in 1980 when Bill Keller joined the Greyhound coaching staff as head basketball coach, replacing Bill Bright's four year stint as coach.

In his first season, Coach Keller took a team that was not to be very good to a 13-14 record and pulled the Greyhounds from the cellar of the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a 4-6, fourth place finish.

The Hounds were a young team, with five freshmen and four sophomores filling the bulk of the roster. Keller's troops played with poise however, and played well with some tough competition. Playoff-bound Ball State barely shed the Hounds at Muncie, 82-79. When nationally ranked Division II power Wright State came to Indy, the Hounds came closer to the Raiders than any team had come to date. Indiana State-Evansville, another national power in NCAA Division II, was also almost upset by the Greyhounds.

Senior Randy Mutschler led the team in scoring this year with a 15.7 average. Freshman Doug Jennings and Junior Bryan Hughes followed with 12.4 and 11.7 averages, respectively. Mutschler grabbed 123 rebounds to lead the club (a 4.7 average) and freshman Scott Pedigo brought down 103 boards for an average of almost four per game.

With new life in the system, Indiana Central looks to be one of the top teams in the league in 1981-82.














Five Underclassmen Lead Ladies To Spot In State

A lineup filled by four freshmen and a sophomore led the 1980-81 Lady Greyhound Basketball team to a second place finish at the AIAW Division II State Tournament and an 18-7 overall record. The State Tourney was held at Nicoson Hall.

At one point, the ladies were struggling with a 5-6 record. Then the girls went hot and won 13 straight until Butler's women knocked off the Hounds in the final game of the tourney.

Coach Jack Noone started sophomore Kim Epler, and freshmen LuAnn Humphrey, Gus Neim, Pam Bright, and Kristie Swing. Together, these ladies accounted for 42.6 points and 27 rebounds per game out of 64.8 and 40.9, respectively. Humphrey led the team in scoring with an 11.7 average and in rebounding with 8.5 a game. Fresh Terri Wiese followed with 9.9 points per game.

Coach Noone can look forward to next year, because he loses just one player to graduation.

The Indiana Central Wrestling team turned the 1980-81 season a turnaround from the previous one by coming from last place in the conference to second in the league. Credit that turnaround to many talented young men and one talented and dedicated coach. Terry Wetherald is that coach, and for his efforts, he was named Coach-of-the-Year in the Heartland Collegiate Conference.

That second place finish was won with good balance all the way up the weight scales. Hounds Receive Bid To NCAA Div. II Playoffs

For the second time in four years, Indiana Central's Baseball Greyhounds received a bid to play in the NCAA Division II Regional. The Hounds under second year coach Bob Tremain flew to Troy, Alabama to play in the double elimination tourney which included host Troy State, Delta State, and Northern Kentucky. The Greyhounds got to the playoffs by winning the Great Lakes Valley Conference and the Heartland Conference. Also present in the judges minds was the 12 game win streak that the Hounds put together after a dismal Spring Break week. Central wound up winning 13 of their last 16 games on the year.


Only one senior was on the roster in 1981, much to the liking of Coach Tremain. That senior was Captain Jeff Duhammel. Jeff was also the recipient of the Kelso-Reid Mental Attitude Award.

Greyhound baseball fans can surely look forward to next Spring, because the young Hounds are ready to return to the playoff picture. Leading the way will be Mike Wishnevski, who set a school record hitting (.487) and slugging (.826), and tied the record for home runs (8) and doubles (11).

Mike was named Most Valuable by his teammates.

The Outstanding Pitcher award was given to freshman Phil Benson. Most Improved was junior Phil Morris. The Defensive award was given to junior Keith Perin. Sophomore Tom Stall was awarded the "Roadrunner" award for stolen bases. The 1981 baseball team set a new school mark for stolen bases in a season with 75. They tied the record for home runs with 22.

Coach Tremain has now evened his record in two years at 34 wins and 34 losses.





The Most Valuable Runner and the Kelso-Reid Mental Attitude Award winner were one in the same. Pam Bailey took both honors.








HOUNDS WIN HCC, LITTLE STATE
















Each year students also have the opportunity to participate in a variety of work camps during the year and also a longer work camp during flex.


ICU Offers A Variety Of Academic Programs









Dr. Richard M. Clutter

The Indiana Central family mourns the loss of Dr. Richard M. Clutter, associate professor of history and political science. His death on November 20, 1980, resulted from a traffic accident in Washington, D.C., where he was attending a conference.

Dick, as we all knew him, had been associated with Indiana Central University almost continuously since 1962 when he first enrolled in the evening division. In 1966 he was graduated summa cum laude with a major in history. That same year he was elected to Epsilon Sigma Alpha and was named "Outstanding Teacher-in Training" at ICU by the Indiana Council for the Social Studies. In 1967 he received a master of arts degree from Indiana University. He became a part-time instructor in the department of history and political science at his alma mater in 1968; in 1972 he became a full-time member of the faculty. Two years later he completed his graduate work at Indiana University and received his doctor of philosophy degree in history.

Professor Clutter, who enjoyed teaching, was also involved in research and writing. His doctoral dissertation was a history of the Indiana Department of the American Legion. He was vice chairman of the Military History Section of the Indiana Historical Society and had been editor of the Military History Journal since its inception in 1976. He wrote "Indiana Guardsmen in the Great War," which is a chapter in the recently published Indiana's Citizen Soldiers. In 1979 and again in

1980 he traveled extensively in Latin America, and he was tentatively planning a trip to Africa in 1981.


As a student Dick was known for his zeal for knowledge and his unusual capacity for hard work. As an instructor he used these attributes to entice his students to extend their horizons and to commit themselves to excellence.

Despite his many professional involvements, Dick found time for a full private life. He was an active sportsman, being a tennis player and an avid snow skier. He was devoted to his family; his wife Goldie, their daughter Susan, and their son Brian. He was a servant of God and a faithful member of Calvary Tabernacle where he had been a member of the Board of Trustees and president of the Calvary Christian School Board of Christian Education.


During his years at Indiana Central, Dick Clutter earned the respect of students and colleagues alike. The large number of persons from both campus and community, who visited the mortuary to pay their last respects, is a testimony to the high esteem in which he was held by those who knew him. He will be sorely missed by all of us.
