



Welcome Freshmen . . .

Free moments were rare for those freshmen who were being welcomed to their new Indiana Central home.









Indiana Central took a quick lead of 14-0 in the first quarter after two touchdowns by Mike Wishnevski, the second following a 38-yard run, and Mark Bohannon's two extra points.





A. Mike Wishnevski (no. 33) fights to carry the ball to a touchdown for ICU during the Homecoming game.

D. John Williams (no. 61) guards quarterback Tom Peller (no. 22) as they lead the Greyhounds to another Homecoming victory.






Brown County Day Held Later

Dances Help Bring People Out Of Walls


During Homecoming weekend, the formal President's Ball was hosted by President and Mrs. Sease.

Greyhounds Are Top Dog





Hounds Tie For Conference Championship

Finishing the Heartland Collegiate Conference 6-1-0, the Indiana Central Greyhounds tied with Franklin College for the championship title. As a result of this accomplishment, ten Greyhound players were named to All-Conference teams, and three were awarded Honorable Mention.

Named to the first team on the offensive side were Jeff Hauswald, senior guard; Wade Hall, junior tackle; Mike Wishnevski, junior fullback; and Bob Brewer, senior tight end. Mark Bless, sophomore tackle, and Pat Parks, junior linebacker, were awarded first team defensive honors. John Williams, junior guard, and Jim Landwerlen, junior center, were named to the second team offense, while Tony Heavrin, senior defensive back, and Mark Smith, junior defensive back, were named to the second team defense. Awarded Honorable Mention for offense were Mark Gilvin, senior quarterback; Bob Bohannon, freshman kicker; and Greg Scarpone, sophomore halfback.

Co-Captains for the 1981 Greyhound football team were Jeff Hauswald and Leo Hickam. Tied for Most Valuable Offensive Player were Mark Gilvin and Bob Brewer. Other outstanding offensive players were Jeff Hauswald and Jim Landwerlen. Pat Parks was named Most Valuable Defensive Player. Other outstanding defensive players were Mark Bless and Tony Heavrin. 















This Year's Basketball Team A Young One





Grapplers Have Fantastic 10-1 Season











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Ladies Maintain Tough Reputation

Men's Track Team Produces National Champion






Lady Greyhounds Make "Tracks" to Little State










Wishnevski, Perin Take Top Baseball Honors










Washington Sends Aid As Speaker


With Sease At The Wheel . . . Watch ICU Go!

In Memoriam

Angus J. Nicoson 1919-1982

Many people have contributed to the success of the Indiana-Kentucky All-Star Basketball series, but no one did more than Angus J. Nicoson.

Nick coached the Indiana All-Stars from 1952 through 1965, "retired" for three years while serving as an officer of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, and coached again from 1969 through 1971.

During his 17 years as All-Star coach, Nick's teams won 19 of the 31 games played (until 1955, only one game was played each year). On those teams were some of the greatest players who ever wore a basketball uniform. Many went on to greater fame as collegians and professionals.

Nick's success as an All-Star coach was due to more than just the talent of his athletes. He could turn individual stars into team players who would work hard to win. He also made certain that every player knew about the Blind Fund and how game proceeds are used to aid sight-afflicted persons.

Nick served as All-Star coach in addition to his full time duties as athletic director and coach at Indiana Central University, where he was on the staff for 30 years. He handled the All-Stars out of love for the game of basketball, and to show his appreciation to the high school coaches in Indiana for what they did to make the state name synonymous with the sport.

Nick died last month of Alzheimer's disease. As a final "Thank You" for all he did to make the All-Star series a success, and in recognition of his many contributions to athletics in general and basketball in particular, tonight's games are dedicated to the memory of a great All-Star: Angus Nicoson.

Fitness For The Future

Fitness Center Breaks Ground

Ground was broken in May of 1982 for the giant Physical Fitness Center. The Center which will be open to students in the fall of '83 will be the largest building on campus.

The dream of having the Center, complete with swimming pool and auxilliary gym, finally became a reality with an ambitious building program, called FITNESS FOR THE FUTURE. The \$10,000,000 project raised \$5,000,000 for the building and other physical plant needs and \$5,000,000 for the fiscal needs of the university.

Since work had already begun when the groundbreaking occurred, a special "airlife" to the construction site was prepared by James "Tippy" Wilhelm, the general contractor. The speakers platform was lifted by a giant crane into the air and gently placed in the middle of where the new Physical Fitness Center will be. All passengers, including Mayor Hudnut, arrived safely.
















Underriders Put It In High Gear To Win The 1982 Cyclerama

Boasts A Fine Student Cast






ICU's *Godspell* Goes To England


Jazz, Pep Bands Get Crowd Fired Up




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
