


The center was used during study breaks, team practices, and improvement of a particular favorite sport or activity.






A big part of college was the dorm life. It varied from studying to sharing time with friends.


At Central, one advantage of dorm life was that other students were close by to study with.

Dorm was fun but it was also a learning experience. It was a chance to learn to live and interrelate with others.







Greyhounds Set Records

Finishing 4-1-1 in the Heartland Collegiate Conference, the 1983 Greyhound football team was able to set many new records this year. Obtaining a record of 6-3-1 came easy to the young team as they tied in the Homecoming game to bring the crowd to their feet. Two of the wins were shut outs against Ferris State and Ashland. Captain Mark Bless was selected to the Kodak All-American 1st Team. Along with this honor Bless was also named in the conference as Most Valuable Defensive Lineman and Most Valuable Player.

Along with Bless the AP Little American Team had Mark Bohannon and Tom Collins as Honorable Mention. Those players selected to the All-Conference team were offensive; 1st team Mark Bohannon kicker, 2nd team, Mike Heymann tight end, Steve Bates, guard, and Captain Greg Scarpone back. On the Defensive team: 1st team; Mark Maze, end; Mark Bless, tackle; Paul Loggan, linebacker; and Tom Collins, back. 2nd team; Greg Schmalfeldt, back. Honorable mentions went to: Jeff Colton, Damon Ridley, Steve Wood, Otto Clements, Dave Vormohr, Greg Mills, Brian Fogg, and Mike Williams.

Honors received at the Fall Sports Banquet were: Most Valuable Defensive Back Tom Collins; Most Valuable Defensive Lineman Mark Bless; Most Valuable Offensive Lineman Mike Williams; Most Valuable Offensive Back Greg Scarpone; Most Valuable Offensive Player Dave Vormohr; Most Valuable Defensive Player Mark Bless. Joe Cathcart received the Kelso Reid Mental Attitude Award. Mark Bohannon held seven of the fourteen records set by the team this year. They were: Most Field Goals per game, 5, and season, 12, Most Points by Kicking, game 16, season 52, longest field goal in a game, 48 yards, and two individual career records, most field goals, 21, and most points by kicking, 120. Dave Vormohr set the new record most total yards offense, game 344, season 1637, 265 rushing and 1372 passing. Vormohr also broke the 1969 record of most yards passing, 1313, with his record of 1372. He also

lacked one completed pass of breaking the 1970 record of 94. Tom Collins set a record of 12 interceptions for the season and 18 for his career.

Though the team was young this year Coach Bless is extremely positive about next year with the experience the team picked up this year.









After posting an 11-17 season, this years team found it hard to even set any goals. The Greyhounds found themselves in several games that came down to the last few determining seconds. Some of these games were in favor while others were not. Along with last years record of 11-15, the game play was also similar this year. The Greyhounds seemed to play right with the opponent during the first period but the second half proved fatal on more than one occasion.

Leading the team in scoring was Jeff Crabtree with 15.7. Mike Yeater followed with 15.0 and Doug Jennings had 14.6. Doug Jennings also is ranked 7th on the All Time Career Scoring Roster. Scott Pedigo lead the team in rebounds with 7.4. Co-Captains for the year were Doug Jennings and Pat Skaggs. Receiving the Mental Attitude Award was Scott Pedigo and Jeff Crabtree was named Most Valuable Player.







Super Season For Lady Greyhounds

The Lady Greyhounds' 20-3 record showed how well the team played together and not as individuals. The team effort also led the ladies to win the 1st Annual Huntington Winter Classic, to become ranked as high as 14th on the NCAA II polls, to reach second in the Great Lake Valley Conference, be ranked 10th with their win/loss record, and 12th with their 76-60 scoring margin in the NCAA II. Though the ladies were definitely a team they had some outstanding individuals. The evident senior leadership gave the team something to build on. Senior LuAnn Humphrey set a new career scoring record of 1092 pts. although she is closely followed by Junior Debbie Law's 1083 points. LuAnn also set a new career record of 819 rebounds. Senior Kristie Swing set a new career record of 125 and a season record of 45 blocked shots. Senior Laura Foreman had 14 assists for a record in one game and Senior Pam Bright had 84 assists for the sea-

son record. Pam also tied her 51.9% field goal percentage with Senior Terri Wiese who set that record in the 1980-81 season. Senior Debbie Cole holds her 1981-82 free throw percentage record of 80.4%. Senior Jenny Denne- man had an impressive 119 rebounds for the season. And Senior Laura Kreiger played as well as student coached for the Greyhounds helping out Coach Mallender.

Captain Debbie Cole received the Kelso Reid Mental Attitude Award. LuAnn Humphrey deservedly was named Most Valuable Player. The Great Lakes Valley Conference named LuAnn Humphrey, Debbie Law, and Laura Foreman to the all Conference team. The Huntington Winter Classic named LuAnn Humphrey to its Most Valuable Player Honor and Debbie Law to its All-Classic team. Coach Mallender commented on his ladies team effort and has a positive attitude about his Lady Greyhounds for next years rebuilding team.



On February 17, 1984, the lives of many Indiana Central students were touched by the death of Anne Peters. She was a part of our lives and we are at a loss because she is with us no more.


