## Curriculum Guide for Bachelor of Science in Nursing - Accelerated BSN Program [ABSN]

Students who withdraw from or receive a grade of C- or lower in more than two prerequisite science or math courses are ineligible to pursue the nursing curriculum.

**MAJOR COURSES: Grade of C+ or above required.**

Admissions to accelerated clinical courses required prior to enrollment in accelerated Nursing classes and clinical.

A minimum 3.0 cumulative UIndy GPA is required to be eligible to apply to the accelerated nursing track. Students must have earned C's or better in all math, science, psychology, social science, and C+'s in NURB courses. A grade of "C" or below, or a "W" (withdraw) in a Nursing course is considered a "failure". A failed course may be repeated only (1) time. Failure in the same Nursing course or a failure in any two (2) or more Nursing Courses will result in dismissal from the

program. Students will not be eligible for admission to the Nursing program if they have failed, withdrawn, or received a grade of “C-” or lower in more than two prerequisite science or math course taken one year prior to admission.

A minimum 2.80 GPA in your previous Bachelor’s degree of combined bachelor’s level work is required for admission.

HESI test results will be considered as part of the clinical admission process. International students must have a English Language score of 92 TOEFL or 7 IELTS.

Admission to the A-BSN is competitive and based on available spaces, GPA, HESI test scores, and grades in science & math prerequisite courses. Satisfactory completion of minimum requirement DOES NOT guarantee admission to the 2nd Degree Accelerated BSN (A-BSN) program.

Nursing Admission Test results will be considered as part of the clinical admission process. UIndy students receive additional consideration in the clinical admission process.

Nursing accelerated courses are arranged in sequential fashion and some courses must be taken during the summer and online. Accelerated nursing courses are not compatible with non-accelerated nursing courses. Students should consult with advisor or academic catalog for specific course prerequisites.
