NOTES:

- A grade of C- (1.7 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all courses applying toward the Criminal Justice Major.
- The Criminal Justice major requires a minimum of 45 credit hours.
- The Bachelor of Science Degree requires a minimum of 120 hours.
- This program may require attendance in both day and extended programs (evening) classes.
