Students majoring in Psychology and planning to apply for early admission to the Master of Science in Psychology program must complete the majority of the requirements for the Psychology major and the General Education Core requirements the first three years of study, and students are encouraged to select a minor or concentration that supports their graduate school goals. Completion of these sets of requirements will take careful planning; therefore, you should consult with your academic and faculty advisors on a regular basis. The following is a *suggested* three-year plan.

NOTE: For students who did not receive early assurance prior to beginning the PSYM but who are still hoping to be accepted into the program under an early admission, decisions on admission into the MS program will be made by the beginning of Semester II of Year III. Those not admitted directly into graduate school may continue toward completing the Psychology BS.

NOTE: Before beginning the MS program in Year IV, a student must complete at least 108 credit hours and have completed most major requirements. Students need to have two courses left in their undergraduate degree to take during their fourth (4th year); students are strongly encouraged to take one psychology elective each semester of their fourth (4th year).

NOTE: Students are not permitted to start the graduate Masters in Psychology curriculum before their fourth (4th) year unless permission has been granted by the Department of Psychological Sciences.

NOTE: Students who have received early assurance for entrance into the MS in Psychology must maintain a **cumulative** and **prerequisite** grade point average of **3.5/4.0**, earn at least a grade of C or higher in each Psychology course, complete the graduate application process the year prior to starting, and continue as a student at the University of Indianapolis.

NOTE: PSYM students are strongly encouraged to take PSY 405 and at least 1 semester of PSY 460 as electives towards the psychology degree.

NOTE: PSYM students are strongly encouraged to take MATH 150 or 180 as their core curriculum Math requirement.

NOTE: Students are encouraged to select a minor or concentration that will support their graduate school goals. Students should discuss their options with their advisor. Elective courses are required for students to meet the minimum credit hour requirement for early admission to the MS program.

++ Students considering the Research Track will be required to submit an additional application. Admittance to the Research Track will be contingent on the student's GPA and possible GRE scores and faculty availability.

NOTE: Electives may be taken in any semester and may involve combinations of 1, 2, or 3 credit hour elective offerings. Some electives might require additional prerequisites not already accounted for in the degree

NOTE: Some tracks may require summer classes.

NOTE: A minimum score of a B- is required for a course to count towards the Master's degree.

#The Research Track course sequence may vary. Students should consult with their advisor.

^^ Students are encouraged to select electives that complement their track and their educational or professional aspirations. Students may petition to have additional courses outside of the DoPS considered as an elective. Students pursuing the Thesis tracks must complete a minimum of 3 elective hours while students pursuing the Program Development and Evaluation track must complete a minimum of 6 elective hours.
